The Solemnity of St Peter & St Paul

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, a celebration which transferred to the Sunday in recent liturgical changes. A few 'high days and holy days' have been transferred to the nearest Sunday, with the aim of making it easier for family life rather than have people tied to a mid-week obligation; but remember, *our gathering for Sunday Mass is an obligation in the best possible sense*: we gather in community, as the local expression of the Body of Christ, to draw strength from the Table of the Word and the Table of the Eucharist, to support one another and to grow in God's blessing. What better way is there for drawing strength for the challenges of daily life than coming together on a Sunday to reflect on God's Word, to be nourished by the Lord and to be encouraged by one another?

The Church stands on the legacy of two pillars: St. Peter and St. Paul, a legacy which rests on the sure foundation of the teaching and the very person of Jesus Christ and a legacy we participate in when we gather together each Sunday to celebrate the Lord's Supper, as he invites us to "do this in memory of me".
