Collections

Thank you, for our collections last week, we raised **£447.88** for the running of the parish and **£287.18** for the APF Mission Appeal

These sums include monies given in Gift Aid envelopes. Our thanks also go to those who donate by Banker's Order direct into the parish account.

November Lists and Mass Intention envelopes for the Holy Souls are available in the church porch for our annual remembrance throughout the month.

Today we celebrate All Saints Day. It is a Solemnity, a holyday of obligation, and is the day that the Church honours all of God's saints, even those who have not been canonized. It is a family day of celebration – we celebrate the memory of those family members (sharing with us in the Mystical Body, the communion of saints) who now share eternal happiness in God's presence. We rejoice that they have reached their eternal goal and ask their prayers on our behalf so that we too, may join them in heaven and praise God through all eternity.

The history of today's celebration goes back to how all Christian martyrs of the Faith were originally honoured on 13 May, but in 615 Pope Boniface IV established the "Feast of All Martyrs" commemorating the dedication of the Pantheon, an ancient Roman temple, into a Christian church dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the martyrs. In 844, Pope Gregory IV transferred the feast to 1 November (now transferred to the nearest Sunday). By 741, the feast included not only martyrs, but all the saints in heaven as well, with the title changing to the "Feast of All Saints" by the year 840. In 1484 Pope Sixtus IV established All Saints Day as a holyday of obligation with the celebration of a vigil (Mass the night before the solemnity), known today as "All Hallows' Eve" or "Hallowe'en". So the real meaning of Halloween is not the celebration of all things dark, quite the contrary, it is a celebration of the light of Christ working in the Saints and in us all. With my prayers as ever for the Light of Christ to shine through all our Parish Family, God bless, *Fr. Adrian.*
