Looking at the Mass

Coming to church on a Sunday is about meeting
together as family and friends, being strengthened by
our relationship with one another and, most
importantly, by our relationship with God. **Over the
next few weeks we are going to look at a summary
of each part of the Mass to think about how each
of us contributes to the life of the Church and how
the Mass contributes to our life.**

Whenever we gather for Mass we mark the memorial
of Christ's death and resurrection, breaking open
God's word into our hearts through hearing the
scriptures (the Liturgy of the Word) and breaking
bread together in Holy Communion (the Liturgy of the
Eucharist). The meaning of "liturgy" stems from the
Greek word for a work of service, so our liturgy should
truly be a service where we're actively participating
and fully involved: serving one another and being
served – in our prayers and in our actions. Mass
should not simply gloss over us as though we were
merely spectators, we all have a part to play.

In the **Liturgy of the Word** we listen and respond
with words of praise and petition for our needs
and the needs of those we hold in prayer; in the
Liturgy of the Eucharist we bring our gifts, not just
our time, our talents and our treasures; but all the
sacrifices we make for God in our lives as we prepare
to receive the sacrifice of the Lord, broken and poured
out for us: the Body and Blood of Christ. The Liturgy
of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist are the
two principal parts of the Mass which should never be
separated as they form a single act of worship. That's
why even our children's liturgy (Little Church) has a
time for being nourished by God's word in a way that

The liturgy of the Mass is framed by the Introductory Rites, which prepare us for God's word and Eucharist, and by the Concluding Rites, which brings our worship to a close and deliberately sends us out to live a Christian life of witness and service in the week ahead, nourished for the task by God's word and Eucharist. In next week's newsletter we'll look at an overview of the Introductory Rites. If you would like to look deeper into the parts of the Mass leaflets will be available from Fr Adrian over the next six weeks, with a different topic each week.
