Collections

Thank you, for our collections last week, we raised £514.51 for the running of the parish and £404.34 for our refurbishment programme These sums include monies given in Gift Aid envelopes. Our thanks also go to those who donate by Banker's Order direct into the parish account.

No doubt you may have heard a lot of talk about marriage in the news lately. In response, we receive a letter from Archbishops Vincent Nichols and Peter Smith on behalf of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales at our Masses this weekend. It is a statement of our Catholic faith about marriage and issued in the light of the forthcoming consultation by the Government on changing the legal definition of marriage. In the light of this letter, you are asked to consider signing the Coalition for Marriage's online petition which can be found at www.C4M.org.uk The petition reads:

"I support the legal definition of marriage which is the voluntary union for life of one man and one woman to the exclusion of all others. I oppose any attempt to redefine it."

After Easter the Archbishops will produce a more detailed leaflet on the Government's consultation itself, for distribution in parishes, to assist us in making own particular response to the consultation.

As we continue Lent, fasting and abstinence can be a bit of a chore without the strength we can get from spending a little extra time each day in **prayer**, even if this is just resting in the silence of the Lord and letting the Lord's pace bring a touch of stillness and comfort to the soul. As last year, families and individuals are invited to use the **Family Reconciliation** sheet at home (see overleaf) or to join us each Monday for **Benediction**, **Novena and the Stations of the Cross**. Not everyone is able to join us then but, if you are free, do please consider joining us in **prayer before the Blessed Sacrament**. Following our schools meeting I have written to the Director of the School's commission concerning the news that more school places may be available to us through the building of a new Catholic Primary school in South Lambeth. I have called again for support in keeping our Parish on Corpus Christi's admission policy and have suggested that any funds available for more school places should be directed at improving the provision in existing schools rather than building a brand new one. When I have a reply I will let you know as the Director is asking us to make our requests to Lambeth Council. Please do not approach the Council as yet as I believe we should mount a concerted campaign once the position of the Diocesan School's Commission is clearer so that our efforts are united. Please continue to pray for the children of our Parish who need places.

Please see the posters around the church for details of our DVD discussion series during the Mondays of Lent: join us in the Parish Hall from 7.30-8.30 pm. All are welcome and it will be a relaxed way of getting to know more about our Christian faith, so feel free to invite friends along who may wonder what being Catholic means. We look forward to seeing you.

Please take home a Family Reconciliation sheet which invites us to celebrate with family or friends (and even by ourselves) a simple service of prayer and reflection during Lent. This activity asks us to focus on our hands in prayer, to draw around the shape of our hand and to write prayers on the cut-out. As last year we will gather up all our different-sized hands on Palm Sunday to use in our Easter services.
