They readily find a home from home in port centres run by Apostleship of the Sea (AoS) personnel. AoS chaplains and volunteers not only provide them with a warm welcome and hospitality in these centres, but also visit them in their ships during short turn-round times, and take them by minibus to many a Catholic parish for daily or Sunday Mass when Mass is not available on board. These are generous and hardworking people, so grateful and appreciative of what Stella Maris, Our Lady Star of the Sea, does for them through the AoS. **On Sea Sunday we are called to remember seafarers in our hearts and prayers.** Let us pray for the intercession of Our Blessed Mother Mary, Star of the Sea, to protect all seafarers and draw them to the heart of her Son, and pray in thanks for the work of the AoS, that our offering in today's second collection will go some way in reaching out to help all those in need at sea or on shore.
