**They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old:

These famous lines, written by Laurence Binyon in his 1914 poem *For the Fallen*, remind us, as they do each Remembrance Sunday, to think of the sacrifice of the countless men and women who gave their lives in the service of their country in the two World Wars and in the many conflicts since. Sadly, war and conflict are still a tragic part of many people's lives throughout the world today. Yet, the sacrifice of the 'Fallen' is not in vain, as their memory serves to raise up people of peace in each new generation to forge a better world, striving to challenge the violence, injustice and greed that destroys so many lives. In the parish of St. Simon and St. Jude we walk in the shadow of those parishioners who lost their lives in the bombing raids of World War II, of those who died in its battles and, in particular, of the twelve men of our parish who died in the 'Great War':

News this week:

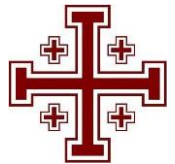

The Market will run from 12-3pm with helpers coming from 11.30am. If you can't help for the whole time please give what time you can. So as to be fair, everyone (volunteers and public) will donate 50p per adult and 20p per child to help support the event in raising funds for the fire escape to the balcony.

Thank you to all who helped make our international night a great success, raising £400 towards our roof costs.
