Collections – loose cash and Gift Aid envelopes Thank you, for our collections last week, we raised. £360.952 for the charitable work of the Parish and £144.07 for the Parish Refurbishment Programme Our thanks also go to those who donate by Banker's Order direct into the parish account.

Please see the important details overleaf about our collections and our Gift Aid support for other charities. Each year, during Lent we help to raise funds for the Cabrini Children's Society (CCS) and for the CAFOD Family Fast Day. Lent is fast upon us and this week we celebrate Ash Wednesday (13 February) with Mass at 9.15am and 7.30pm so please join us then.

Lent is a time for prayer and reflection in preparation for the wonderful celebration of Easter and we should think about ways we can become involved in the traditional aspects of prayer, almsgiving and fasting or abstinence over this time. One way to have some spare cash in these difficult financial times is to have a simple meal of soup and bread that replaces a main meal one day, with the money saved being given as a Lenten offering.

As well as giving up through fasting or abstinence during Lent, why not take up a deliberate choice of spending a little extra time each day in prayer, even if it's just resting in the silence of the Lord and letting the stillness and peace bring some comfort to the soul? Separate to our Doorway to Faith programme, as last year, families and individuals are invited to pray and reflect on the scriptures using the Walk With Me booklet (on sale for £1) and to use the prayer cards to help prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation (all our booklets or cards are available in the porch with the donation slot to the right of the front door). In addition to this, if you're free on a Monday, please join us for Benediction, Novena and the Stations of the Cross. If you're not able to join us in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament you might like to try the web links below. The first gives the Stations of the Cross for children and the second for adults...

Thank you to all our donors including those who give directly into the Parish account and to those who donate using the Parish Gift Aid envelopes. Our newsletter and announcements clearly state each week what the collections are for and, where we raise funds for other charities, requests are always made to use the charity's own donation envelope. To bring further clarity from 1 January 2013 all monies donated to the Parish account by standing order or via a Parish Gift Aid envelope are exactly that - monies donated for the work of the Parish. However, throughout the year we hold a number of collections to support other charities. For those able to Gift Aid their donations, when we hold a second collection for an external charity [such as Cabrini or Cafod], if you wish to make a Gift Aid donation to that charity please use the charity's own **donation envelope** to ensure that the charity can claim. On handful of occasions, such as this weekend, donations that are not Gift Aided (either to the Parish or to an external charity) may be divided on an equal basis between the Parish charity and the external one. In brief: → all monies donated directly to Parish bank account are for the work of the Parish → all monies donated via a Parish Gift Aid envelope are for the Parish → all monies donated via a charity's Gift Aid envelope are for that charity → any donation to the 2nd collection at Mass not in a Gift Aid envelope will be allocated as stated in the newsletter. Thank you for your support.

Don't forget to buy the **Doorway to Faith** booklet for only £1 from the porch, reduced from £1.50.

Thank you, as always, for your contributions to the Parish collections, our second collection next week is for our refurbishment programme. Please remember if you contribute via the Gift Aid scheme to use the envelopes provided at the entrance to the church. To help plan your giving please take enough envelopes home for the month so that you can complete the details of the envelope beforehand and bring them with you to church. If writing a cheque, please make out a separate cheque for each collection, with cheques payable to 'St Simon & St Jude Catholic Church'.

PRAYING FOR THE SICK: please remember that there is a list in the porch where you can request prayers for those in need. The sick and housebound are very much at the heart of the church and support us in their prayers as we support them with ours at every Mass.

SUPPORTING OUR PARISH

Please give what you can to the parish collections as we receive less money each week than is budgeted for our needs.
