A Farewell from Pope Benedict XVI At his final General Audience in Saint Peter's Square on

Wednesday, 27th February 2013, Pope Benedict XVI, speaking in English and summarising his address, said: "I offer a warm and affectionate greeting to the Englishspeaking pilgrims and visitors who have joined me for this, my last General Audience. Like Saint Paul, whose words we heard earlier, my heart is filled with thanksgiving to God who ever watches over his Church and her growth in faith and love, and I embrace all of you with joy and gratitude. During this Year of Faith, we have been called to renew our joyful trust in the Lord's presence in our lives and in the life of the Church. I am personally grateful for his unfailing love and guidance in the eight years since I accepted his call to serve as the Successor of Peter. I am also deeply grateful for the understanding, support and prayers of so many of you, not only here in Rome, but also throughout the world. The decision I have made, after much prayer, is the fruit of a serene trust in God's will and a deep love of Christ's Church. I will continue to accompany the Church with my prayers, and I ask each of you to pray for me and for the new Pope. In union with Mary and all the saints, let us entrust ourselves in faith and hope to God, who continues to watch over our lives and to guide the journey of the Church and our world along the paths of history. I commend all of you, with great affection, to his loving care, asking him to strengthen you in the hope which opens our hearts to the fullness of life that he alone can give. To you and your families, I impart my blessing. Thank you!"

Although there's always so much in life that can get in the way of our preparation for Easter, Lent can be such a blessing when we give time to think about the needs of others and become involved in traditional aspects of prayer, fasting or abstinence and almsgiving. Each week why not consider replacing a large main meal with a simple meal of soup and bread, with the money that would be saved given as "Lenten alms" - our sacrificial donation to charities. Each Lent as a Church we are asked to support the CAFOD Fast Day and Cabrini Children's Society. If you would like to give your Lenten Alms to the work of these two charities, Gift Aid donation envelopes are available at the front of the church where you can post vour donation in our Lenten Alms box.

As well as trying to fast or abstain during Lent, why not take up a deliberate choice of spending a little extra time each day in prayer, even if it's just resting in the silence of the Lord and letting his pace bring a touch of stillness and comfort to your soul. One way to do this is by praying before the Blessed Sacrament. We meet to pray as usual this Monday with exposition beginning after Morning Prayer followed by our St Jude Novena and Stations of the Cross at noon.
