REFLECTION. Parents often give advice to their children because they have a rich experience and they can foresee things that children cannot yet see or comprehend, so it is with God who sees and knows all. In the First Reading from Isaiah, we are told to trust in God, whose ways are different than ours because he sees and knows more than we do. We need to seek God out – "Seek the Lord while he may be found" and call upon him to use God's wider lens. The Gospel teaches us what God is like in the parable of the landowner who certainly does not behave in any way like a good employer. God (the landowner) thinks differently than the typical employer. In Jesus' time people trusted employers to know when a job was needed, and instead of employees searching for jobs, the landowners would be doing the searching if there was a job. This particular landowner in the parable is a very generous landowner. But his generosity extends out in ways that are very foreign to contemporary thoughts of fairness, justice and equality. The landowner goes out at noon, at three and at five to offer unemployed persons jobs in his vineyard. Why did the landowner choose to be so generous to the last groups, and only pay the negotiated price to the first who had worked longer and harder, we don't know. But God's ways are not our ways, just as the landowner's ways were not the employees' ways. We are told that there were two types of employers in Jesus' time – employers and patrons. Employers tended to bargain for wages and/or pay the wages agreed upon. Patrons, on the other hand, were gift givers. They treated people like family, though if you had a patron, things were expected of you as well – loyalty, speaking well of the patron and special favours. The landowner in this parable treated the first group like an employer would and the other groups like a patron would. The kingdom of heaven is like that: all are treated fairly and get the same wage; to live with God with joy in his kingdom for eternity. We need to accept God's plan and be pleased with what we are given, knowing that it is just and fair. We should not envy others for what they have, especially when we have what we need. In the second reading Paul talks about God as a patron, not an employer. As much as Paul seems to want to die to be with Christ, he knows that the
