Palm Sunday

At the 6pm Vigil and 12.15 pm Mass on Sunday we gather with palms in the church. At the **10.30 am Family Mass, if you are able, please walk down to the Hall** as the Mass begins there with a palm procession back up to the main church building. Thank you.

Holy Week and Easter Celebrations

Maundy Thursday: 8pm Mass of the Lord's Supper.

After this Mass please join us in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose in the Lady Chapel. Prayer will be guided by music and readings and will end at 10pm so please stay if you are able.

Good Friday: Services at 10am and 3pm

Stations of the Cross for families and children will be held in the church at 10am, with tea, coffee and hot cross buns available in the hall afterwards for participants. The Solemn Liturgy for Good Friday will start at 3pm, including the Veneration of the Cross.

Easter Vigil 8 pm Saturday 11 April

Our Easter Mass begins at 8pm outside the Parish Hall, from where we'll process into the church. If the weather's awful we'll gather directly in the church.

8pm starting outside the Hall: Easter Vigil

Our Mass begins in the darkness of the evening. In kindling a new fire and lighting the paschal candle, we are reminded that Christ came as a light shining in the darkness.

During the candle procession: Fr Adrian: Christ our light!

Congregation: **Thanks be to God.**

On reaching the church door, after the second acclamation, the congregational candles are lit. Please pass the flame from one to another but do not use a lighter or matches and **do not allow children under 12 to carry a lit candle**. The candles are extinguished after the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) and relit for the renewal of baptismal promises.

A reading from the book of Genesis [1:1-2:2] – Our creation

A reading from the book of Genesis [22:1-18] – Abraham's sacrifice

A reading from the book of Exodus [14:15ff] followed by the Response: **I will sing to the Lord, glorious his triumph!**

After a concluding prayer the altar candles are lit and we sing the Gloria: Hymn no. 26 **Glory! Glory! Glory to God!**

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans [6:3-11]

Fr Adrian then sings the Alleluia which is used as our response to the psalm: **Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark [16:1-7]

The Baptisms begin with the Litany of the Saints
